### **AMIS Plus Questionnaire**

## **Hospital Auditing**

The Steering Committee developed a code of conduct attesting that the participating hospitals satisfy the required criteria. In 2011 and early 2012, completeness and correctness was assessed in 5 hospitals selected at random. The auditors were warmly received in all hospitals and the cooperation of the hospital principal investigators and their co-workers was exemplary. The auditing results were overall satisfactory. 0.1% of the findings were critical or major and 2.3% were minor. No errors were found at the Luzerner Kantonsspital **Wolhusen**, congratulations! These visits will be continued this year.

# **AMIS Plus Highlights Box**



To assess delays to treatment in Switzerland between 2000 and 2010 the AMIS Plus data of 10,408 STEMI patients who underwent PCI from 66 hospitals were used. Delay between symptom onset and admission decreased during this period from 180 min (IQR 105, 482 min) to 170 min (IQR 100, 392 min). Female patients had an 11% longer adjusted pre-hospital delay. Door-to-balloon time decreased from 60 minutes (IQR 30, 155 min) in 2000 to 53 minutes (IQR 20, 90 min) in 2010, which was mostly due to the decreased time for women. Therefore, pre-hospital delay of STEMI patients is still too long but door-to-balloon time in Switzerland is well within the guideline-recommended timeframe. These data were presented at ESC in 2011 [Eur Heart J 2011; 32(Abstract Suppl):740] and published as a short article. Radovanovic D. et al.
