## Routine Activities

- New AMIS Plus Questionnaire/Long-term Follow-up The new online data questionnaire is up and running. Please be sure to only use the new, revised paper questionnaire and not the old one anymore. Patient follow-up is now being carried out, 3and 12-months following the cardiac event.
- New Data Entry System

For online data entry, the Survey Manager now lists all completed cases since April 1 as well as all incomplete cases. When starting online entry of a new questionnaire it is possible to enter a comment in the comment field, e.g. the patient ID number, which will enable you afterwards to see from the list which patient cases have been completed.

If you open any test cases, could you please delete them once you've finished to avoid cluttering up the server.

• Online Analysis

The online analysis has finally been updated and is once again ready for regular use. We apologise for this delay but a change in the system always, unfortunately, takes longer than originally planned. Please note that the variables you are now downloading differ from the old version of online analysis.
